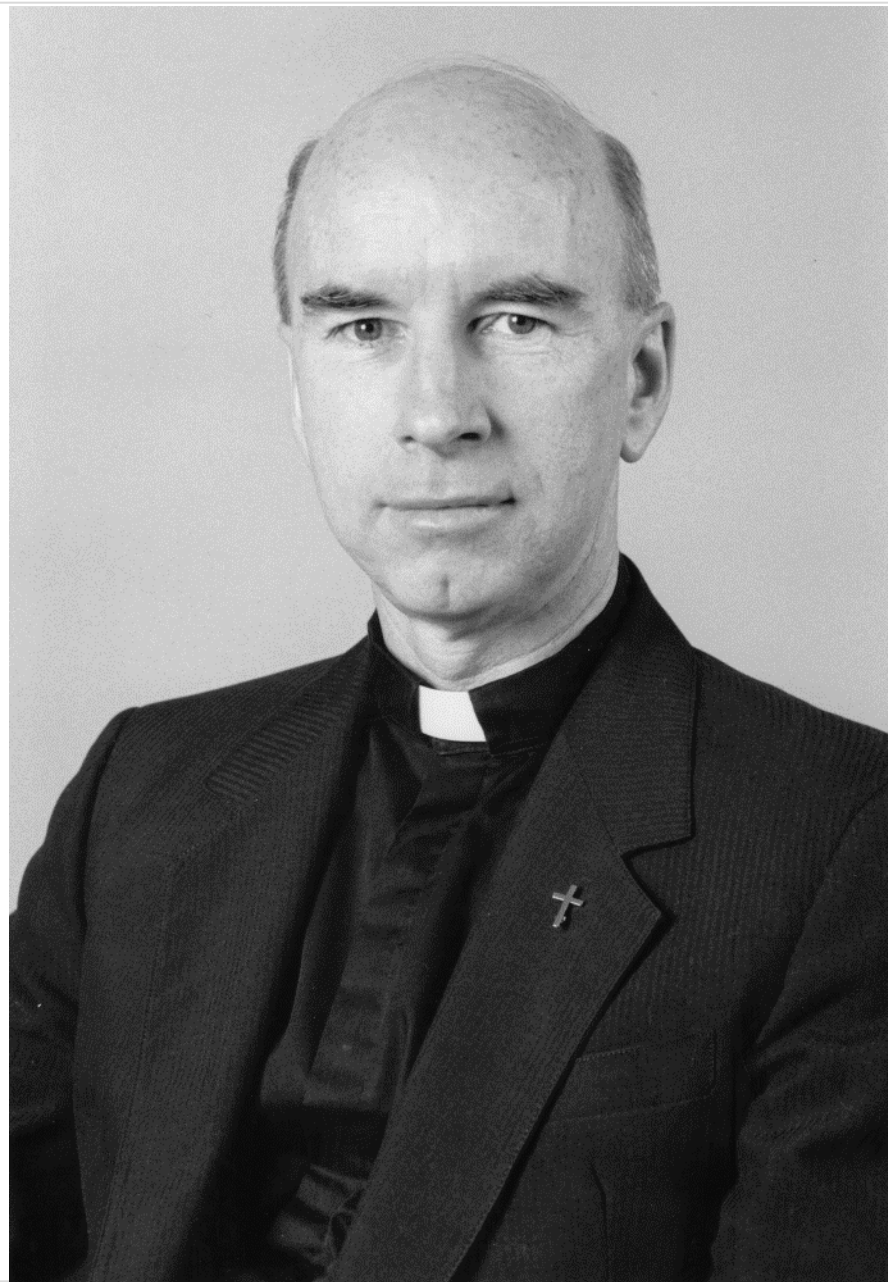

Mission to Malawi

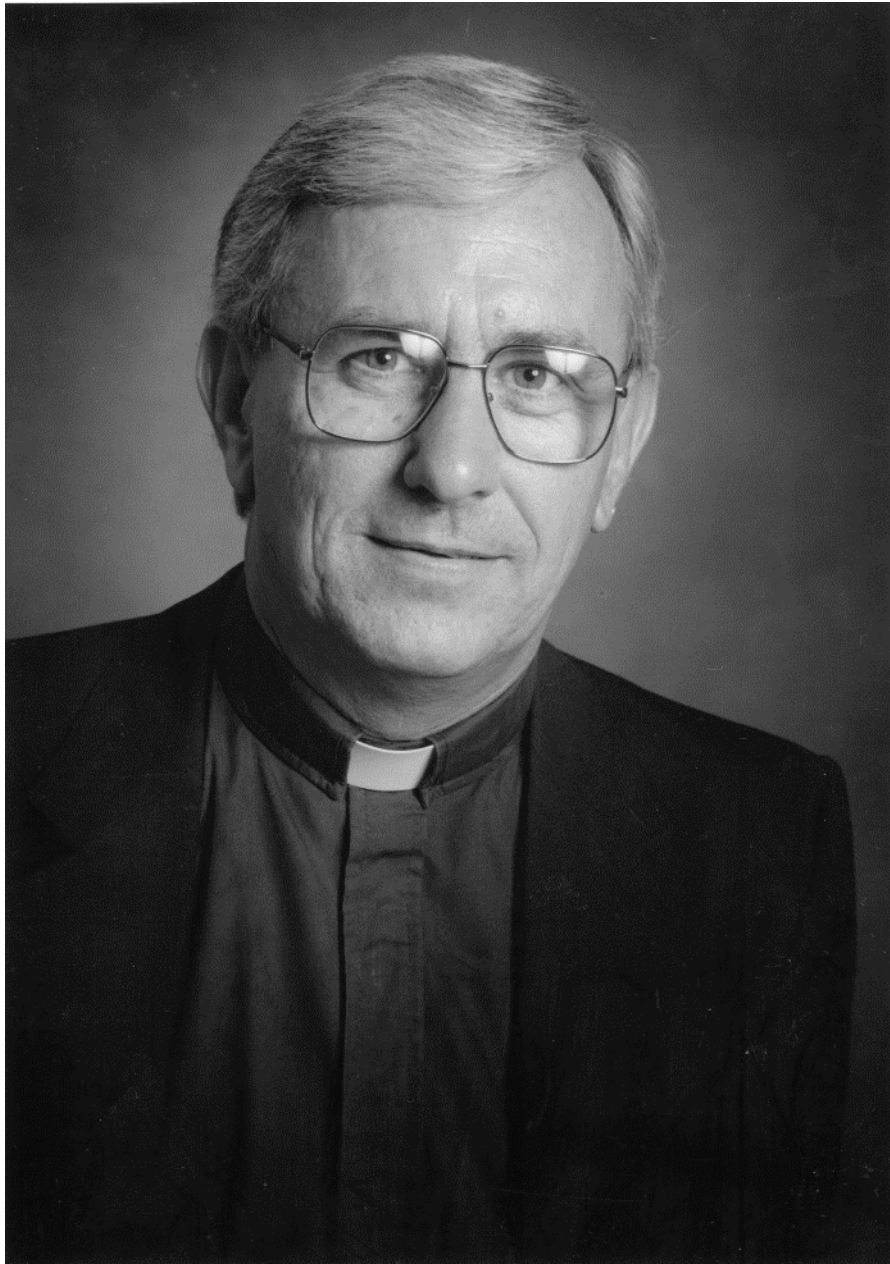
Lay missionaries Beverley and Raymond Vantomme arrive in January 1996 to start the mission.

David works with the University of Nairobi on a Canadian government funded AIDS project, and Elena works with children.

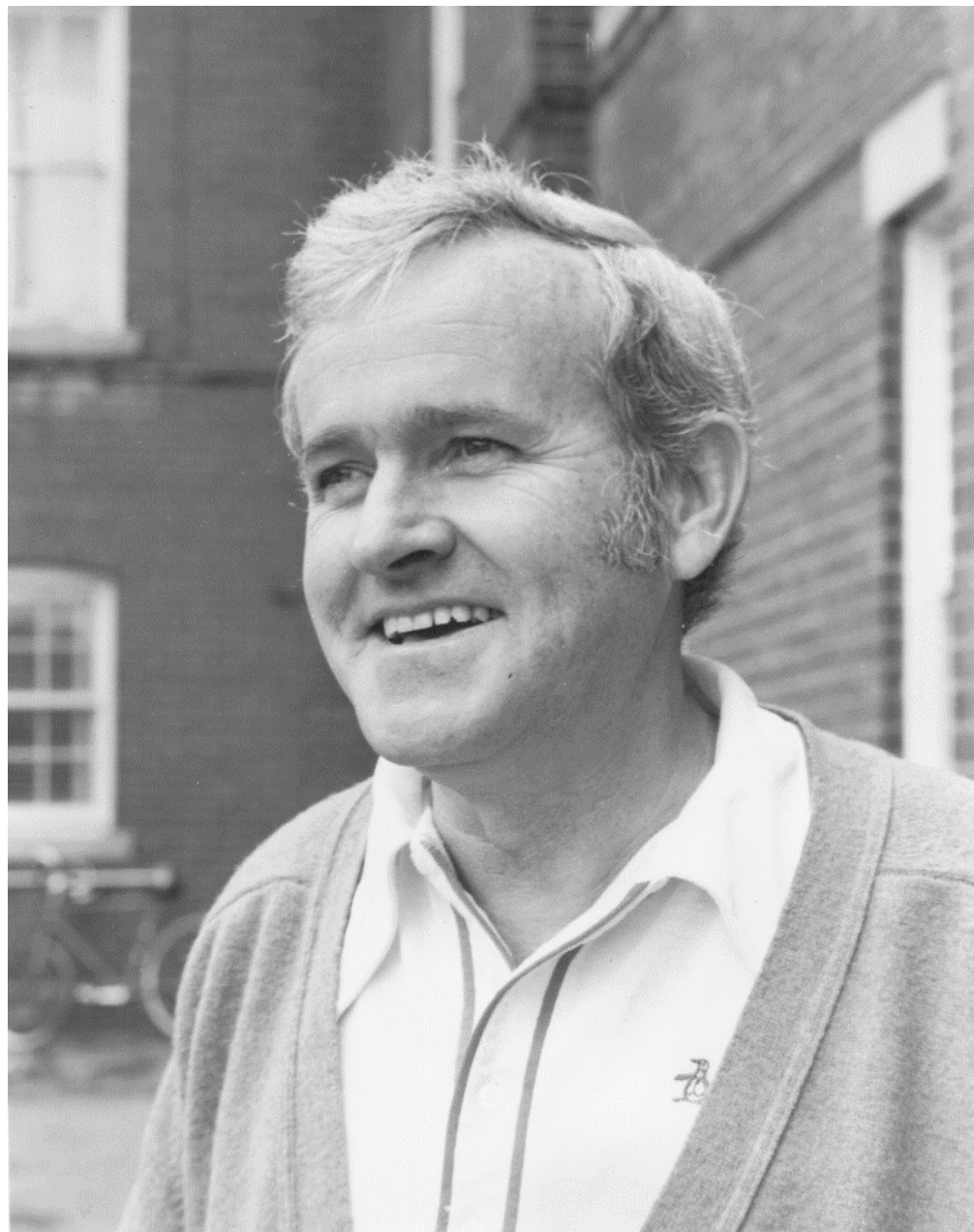


A commitment to Interfaith Dialogue

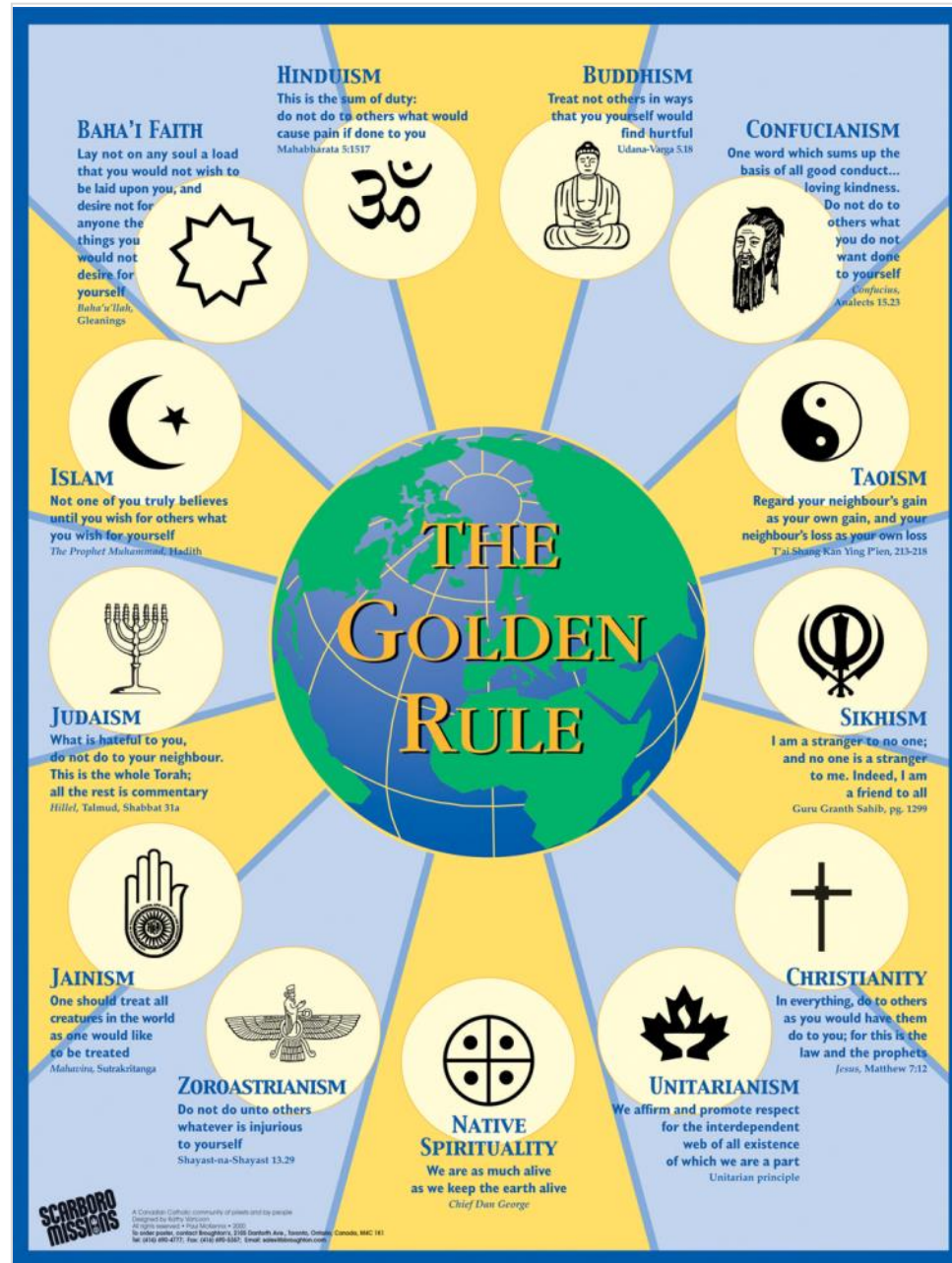

The Golden Rule

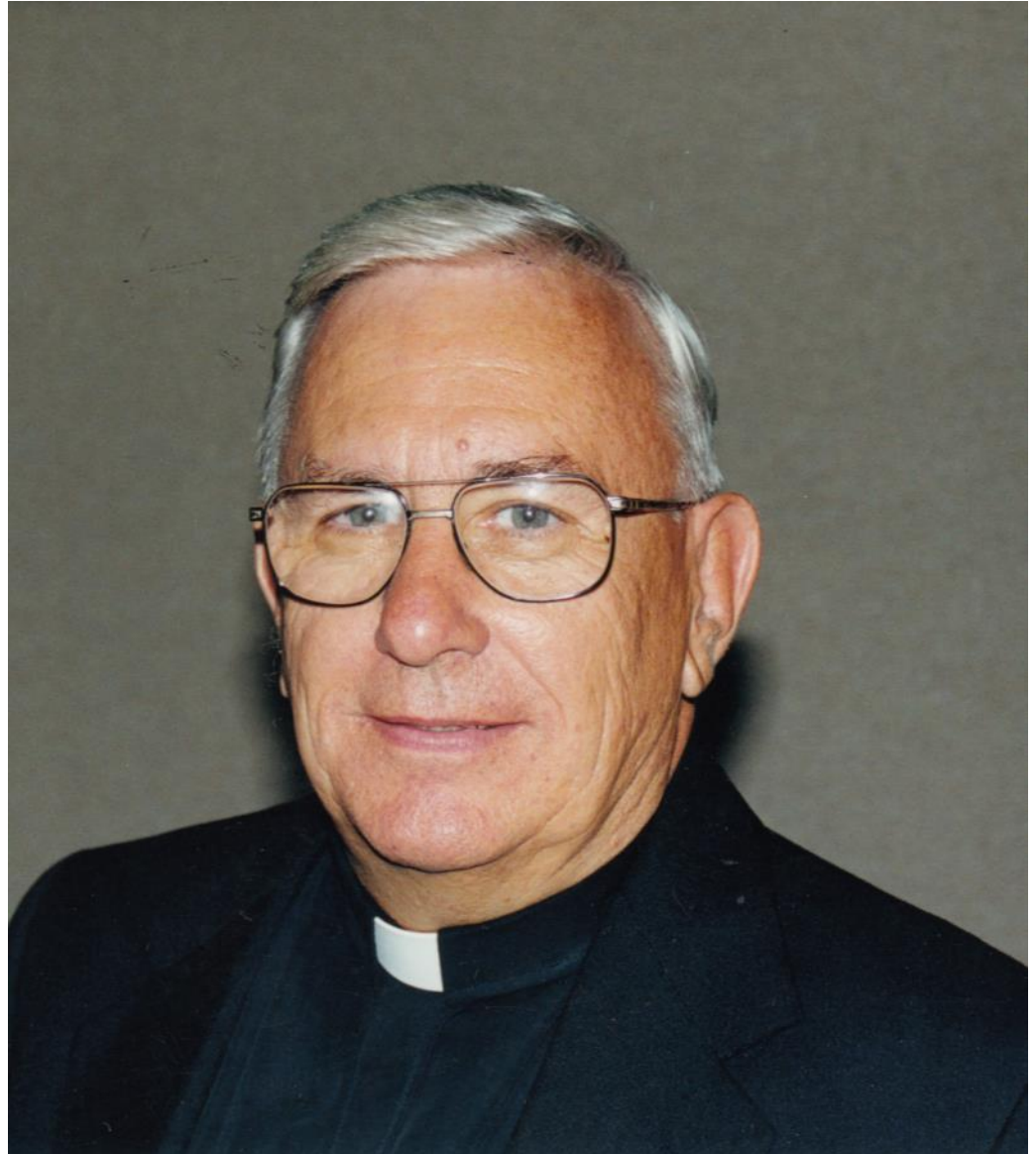
- In 2000, Scarboro Missions publishes the Golden Rule Poster created by its interfaith consultant Paul McKenna.
