

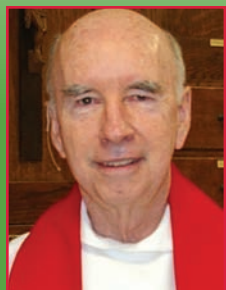

*Dear partner in mission,*

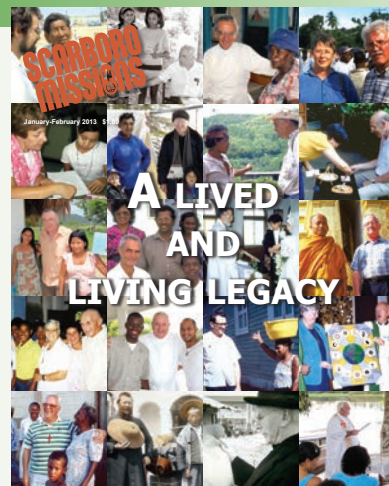

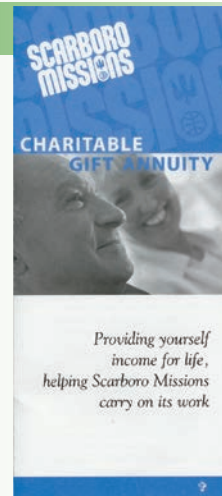

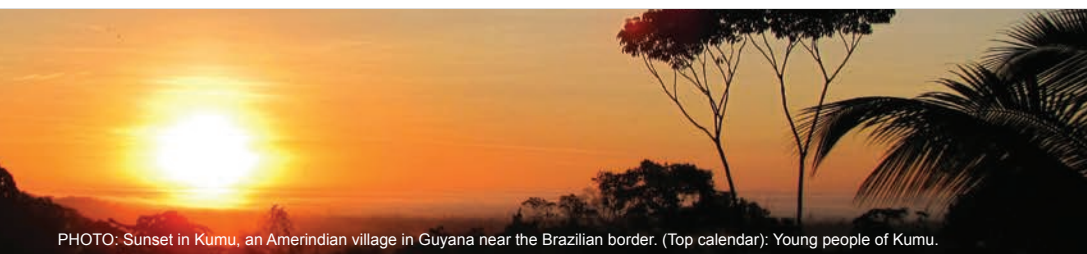
